"The main message I try to get to people is, don't all leave at once," Mayor Perry says. "The fireworks ends, and, hey, have an ice cream cone or a slice of pizza or candy apple. Walk around a little. Let it happen gradually, rather than everybody runs to their car and they all just bottleneck."
